About the Camp

Our model, research-based Metabolic Camp offers a unique opportunity for young women ages 12 and up with PKU or MSUD to live and learn together in a supportive camp environment.

Goals of the camp:

1. To teach the importance of nutrition and help the campers develop diet self-management skills.
2. To review the treatment recommendations of PKU and MSUD prior to and during pregnancy.
3. To create a place to share experiences and make new friends with other young women who have PKU or MSUD.
4. To research the impact of the above interventions on the transition to adulthood, pregnancy, quality of life, and overall health outcomes.

The camp program focuses on building social support through a variety of activities:

Nutrition Education
Cooking Classes
Discussion Groups
Cooperative Sports
Local Field Trips
And More!



The camp will be conducted for five consecutive days. Meals will be provided and supplemented with low protein foods. Registered dietitians will be present to assist at all meals.

Accommodations

The Metabolic Camp will be held on the campus of Emory University. Lounge, refrigerator and laundry facilities will be available on site. All participants will be responsible for their own transportation to and from camp.

Banquet



A banquet for campers, their parents, local PKU and MSUD patients and their families (10 years of age or older) will be held on Friday, **June 26, 2009** at Emory University. This event provides a wonderful opportunity for families and professionals to strengthen their relationships with one another. The evening begins with a social time followed by dinner. The cost of the banquet is **\$30.00** per person. Camper banquet fees are included in the cost of camp. A separate invitation to RSVP for the banquet will be sent out at the end of April.

Faculty

There will be one faculty member and one assistant per every 5-7 campers. The faculty will be involved in helping campers with daily activities. In case of any medical emergency, we will use Children's Healthcare of Atlanta at Egleston or Emory University Hospital, where a medical geneticist is always on call.

Cost of Camp

\$325.00 per person

This cost includes room, board, all sponsored group activities, and the banquet. A **\$100.00** nonrefundable deposit is required to hold a place for each camper. This fee will be applied towards the total \$325.00 camp fee.
